Learning Focus:

Math: Students are learning to use a variety of strategies when adding and subtracting (e.g., count on/back, doubles, related doubles, adding to find the difference, making, and bridging 10, place value adding, operations using 2-digit numbers, number talks and problem solving etc.). Students are identifying, describing, and creating patterns.

Science: We are continuing to learn about the water cycle.

Socials: We are continuing with our study on 'Identity - This is my story'. Attached is a Family Tree. Please fill out and return by the end of the week. We will be discussing that a family tree is a way people can track their family history and tell the story of their family. With this information each student will create a Family Totem Pole.

Ms. Gunanoot discussed how to make a Drum and the importance of drumming with the students last week. This week they are very excited to make their own drums.

Language Arts: Students are learning to read and view for information (e.g., retelling, predicting, making personal connections, and giving an opinion with a reason). As well, when reading they are learning to use a variety of word/sense strategies and are working on their reading fluency. When writing, students are learning to add details, interesting words and varying the beginning of their sentences. They continue to write a good sentence that begins with a capital, put spaces between words and end with punctuation. As well, we are learning the importance of oral storytelling.

ADST: Students have been doing a variety of unplugged coding activities. They are learning to write and interpret code through play and collaboration.


