Newsletter - October 8, 2025

Dear Walnut Park Families,

As we move into October, I want to take a moment to reflect on the strong start we've had to the school year. Our students have settled into routines with confidence, and there's a positive energy building throughout the school. Whether it's the way students are caring for our shared spaces, supporting one another, or engaging in learning, it's clear that we are off to a great start.

This year, we're placing a strong focus on two key goals at Walnut Park:

- 1. Creating a calm, respectful, and structured school environment, and
- 2. Improving literacy outcomes for all students.

A New Approach to Literacy

I am excited to share that Walnut Park has launched a school-wide initiative to strengthen the literacy skills of our students.

In our **primary classrooms (K-3)**, all teachers are now using the **UFLI Foundations** program. UFLI (University of Florida Literacy Institute) is a structured literacy program that teaches students how to decode words by focusing on phonemic awareness (the ability to hear and manipulate sounds in words), phonics (the relationship between letters and sounds), and spelling patterns. This approach helps students build strong foundational skills that are essential for fluent reading and writing.

Each week, students are introduced to new sounds and spelling patterns through engaging, hands-on lessons. They practice reading and writing words using these patterns, and they apply their learning in connected texts. UFLI is systematic, explicit, and designed to meet the needs of all learners—including those who may struggle with reading.

In our intermediate grades (4-7), we're continuing a similar focus through small-group reading instruction three times per week. These groups allow teachers to target specific reading skills—such as vocabulary, fluency, and comprehension—based on student needs. Our intermediate teachers are also participating in ongoing professional development, including a bi-weekly course on the Science of Reading, to deepen their understanding of effective literacy instruction.

We believe that every child deserves to become a confident, capable reader, and we're excited about the progress we're already seeing. I encourage you to read with your children at home and supply them with reading materials to reinforce what they are learning at school. Less screen time and more book time is a great place to start!

Looking Ahead

There's a lot to look forward to this month—from cross-country races, Halloween colouring contests, to parent-teacher interviews. I'm proud of the way our students are embracing new expectations and rising to the challenges of the year. Thank you for your continued support and partnership, it truly makes a difference.

Please report all absences prior to 9:20AM for the current day. If your child has an upcoming appointment, you can also schedule future absences by using one of these three methods.

Messages for Students We understand that from time to time, unexpected situations arise that require you to contact the school to relay a message to your child or make a change to their after-school plans. We are always happy to help when emergencies occur.

However, we've seen a significant increase in the number of calls requesting messages to be delivered to students. This has become increasingly difficult to manage. Due to the busy nature of the school day and the fact that classes are often learning in various locations around the building, it is not always possible to ensure messages are delivered in a timely or accurate manner.

To help us minimize disruptions and ensure smooth communication, we kindly ask that you make every effort to finalize after-school plans with your child before the school day begins. This will help us avoid any potential mix-ups and ensure your child gets home safely.


